

## Practice Assessment Activities: ABIM MOC & CME/CE

Although ABIM extended the decision not to require Practice Assessment, Patient Voice and Patient Safety in its MOC program through December 31, 2018, physicians can still earn MOC points for completing approved Practice Assessment activities.

ASCO offers physicians the opportunity to earn MOC points for quality improvement and patient safety activities on ASCO eLearning and selected meetings. See below for a list of activities that offer the ability to earn ABIM MOC points.

ABIM Requirements for MOC Submission:

- ABIM ID,
- First and last name (as reflected in the Diplomate record),
- Date of birth (Month/Year),
- Date of activity completion

Process for Requesting ABIM MOC points and CME/CE Credits for QOPI® Certification Program and QOPI®

- Eligible practice(s) will receive notification from ASCO
- Each individual in practice will submit an evaluation through the QOPI® Certification Program and/or Quality Oncology Practice Initiative (QOPI®) course hosted on ASCO eLearning.
- Each individual will complete an evaluation on ASCO eLearning
- Certificates are available for download (please note: you must update your ASCO profile with your professional role to be able to access the relevant certificates)
- Individuals will complete the MOC tab in the ASCO eLearning platform
- 20 ABIM MOC Part IV will be awarded

**Please note: That it can take 24 to 48 hours for the 20 MOC points to be reflected in the ABIM diplomate record. ABIM will send an automatic email notification once the points have been added.**

## Meeting-Based Practice Assessment Activities

### 2020 Quality Care Symposium Abstract Presentation

**MOC Points:** 20 | **CME/CNE Credits:** 20 available for approved abstracts | Available through March 12, 2021, at 5:00 pm EST

Abstract presenters at the ASCO Quality of Care Symposium may be eligible to receive Maintenance of Certification (MOC) practice assessment points from the American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM). To be eligible, abstracts must be based on quality improvement (QI) activities that clearly follow the PDSA cycle, and include baseline and follow up data post-intervention for a minimum of 25 patients. Also, abstracts must be accepted for oral or poster presentation. To apply for MOC points, the first authors should indicate during the abstract submission process, whether this abstract should be considered for the receipt of ABIM MOC points. Those abstracts that are identified as having an interest in receiving MOC points will be reviewed by Symposium leadership to confirm that all requirements for a QI project have been met. If your abstract is accepted for ABIM MOC points, it will also be awarded 20 CME or CNE credits. At the time

of abstract notification, the first author of eligible abstracts will receive information on how to submit to ASCO for ABIM points and CME/CNE credits. The first author is responsible for sharing this with coauthors who wish to apply for points/credits.

*To be eligible, the practice must complete two (2) consecutive rounds (e.g., Spring 2019 and Fall 2019). A participant can only request ABIM MOC Part IV for one time for each round in a submission year (e.g., Spring 2019 and Fall 2019 for 2019 submission is eligible; Fall 2018 and Spring 2019 is **not** eligible for the same practice if they already submitted for 2019 submission year).*

To be eligible, the practice must finish the Quality Training Program Session 3 in the year of credit/point request.
